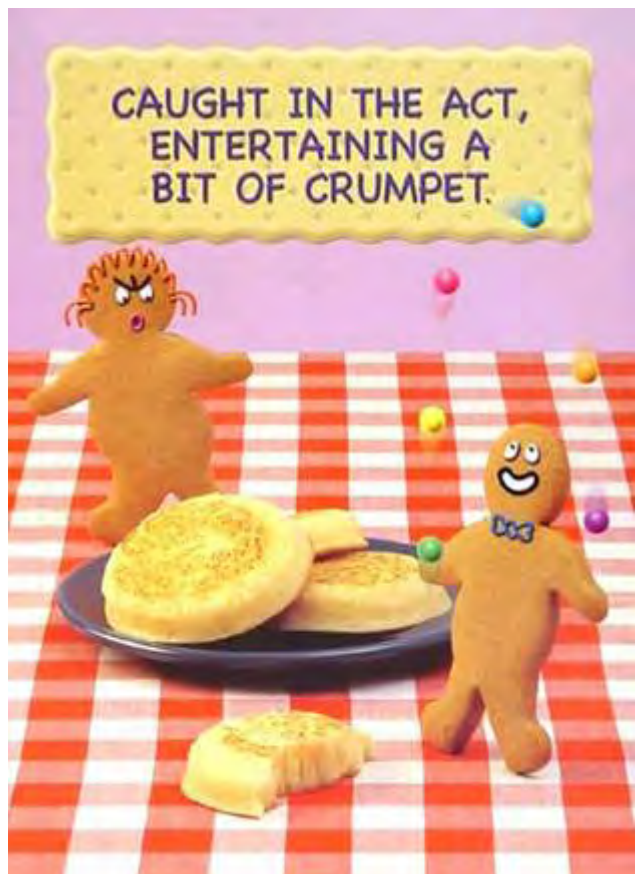

How to store your motorcycle over winter.

For those of you who do not wish to ride your gleaming machines through the winter or are lucky enough to have a second vehicle, here are a few recommendations for how to store your bike over the next few months.

Rule 1: are you sure you really want to do this? There can still be great riding to be had over the next few months and of course all our planned run outs.

Rule 2: have you somewhere secure to keep it? And more importantly is it dry? If it is not dry you may as well use your bike any way.

Having satisfied either above requirements this is how you can go about it.

It is good practice to have your bike in as good a condition as possible before storing, so now is the time for the last enthusiastic clean and polish.

Changing the oil will also ensure that no old oil will sludge up and clog the system when you first start the bike in the spring

It is best to put the bike away on a dry day when you have had a chance to get the bike to optimum temperature, this will clear the exhausts of any moisture, and if recently cleaned dry thoroughly.

Try to leave as little fuel inside the bikes tank as possible as this will "go off" and the carbs will become clogged. Draining the carbs is also useful.

Remove the battery and charge regularly, obviously check if you have an alarm first how this may affect it, a slow charger should keep the battery in good stead.

If you have a bike stand use that to help support the bike, so the tyres do not develop flat spots. Do not over inflate tyres but do check pressures are correct.

Some recommend spraying exposed areas with barrier protection such as WD40, if your storage area is dry this should not be a problem.

Do not use plastic to cover the machine as this creates a moisture trap. If you cover your bike try not to let cover touch painted surfaces of your machine.

So that's it, just remember to check on the bike regularly and that when you get back on in the spring to check all is ok before you jump on. Take it easy for the first few journeys as brakes etc will need time to settle back in, and it will give you time to assess any mechanical damage from storage.
